Senate Bill 5052 Tasks for DOH

- <u>Department of Health tasks</u>:
 - Standard authorization form
 - 30+ reporting mechanism
 - <u>Reports</u>: specialty clinics, cost of database, and scheduling options
 - Continuing education for authorizing professions
 - Product rules
 - Database rules
 - Medical marijuana consultant rules



Authorization Form

- Posted to our website in late June 2015.
- Must be used for all <u>new</u> authorizations or renewals beginning July 24, 2015.
- Must be used for <u>all</u> authorizations beginning July 1, 2016.
- Authorizations on any other form are invalid beginning July 1, 2016.



Legislative Reports

- Recommendations on specialty clinics was completed in December 2015
- Scheduling of Marijuana was completed January 2016.
- Report on the cost of implementing the database is due November 2016.



Practitioner Continuing Education

- In January 2016 a workgroup was formed involving the 2 boards and 2 commissions who license authorizers to work collaboratively
- The goal is to provide continuing education based on the authorization practice guidelines already created by the 2 boards and 2 commissions
- This work is still underway



Product Compliance Rules

- Filed emergency rules for on 10/5/15:
 - Producers, processors and labs needed time to prepare before July 1, 2016.
 - New retailers and existing retailers seeking a medical endorsement needed to know what the requirements will be.
- Filed documents for permanent rulemaking on 10/5.
- Emergency rules re-filed in early February with minor changes.
- Working to finalize our rule making now.



Product Compliance Rules

INPIER 246.

COMPLIA

- Enhanced standards for:
 - Additional quality assurance testing
 - Pesticide screening
 - Heavy metal screening
 - Mycotoxins
 - Labeling
 - Safe handling
 - Employee training
- Compliant products use a logo designed by the department.





Authorization Database Parameters

- A retailer with a medical endorsement may add qualifying patients who volunteer to participate, to the database.
- Authorized healthcare practitioners may access patient healthcare information from the database.
- Approved persons may confirm recognition card validity (Law Enforcement, DOR, DOH).
- Qualifying patients may learn who has accessed their healthcare information.

Cardholder vs. Non-Cardholder

Cardholder

- May purchase 3 times the recreational limits
- May possess 6 plants and up to 15 if authorized
- Purchases at endorsed retail stores are not subject to sales tax
- Arrest protection
- May participate in a cooperative

Non Cardholder

- Restricted to purchasing the recreational limits
- May only possess 4 plants
- Purchases at retail stores are subject to sales tax
- Affirmative defense only
- May not participate in a cooperative



Amounts of Marijuana

Recreational Limits

- Usable Marijuana (1 oz maximum)
- Solid Infusion (16 oz maximum)
- Liquid Infusion (72 oz maximum)
- Concentrates (7 g maximum)

Medical Cardholder Limits

- Usable Marijuana (3 oz maximum)
- Solid Infusion (48 oz maximum)
- Liquid Infusion (216 oz maximum)
- Concentrates (21 g maximum)



Consultant Certification Training

- Training programs must include a minimum of 20 total instruction hours in the following subjects:
 - 5 hours about Washington state laws and rules relating to marijuana
 - 2 hours about qualifying conditions and the common symptoms of each
 - 2 hours about the short- and long-term positive and negative effects of cannabinoids
 - 5 hours about products that may benefit qualifying patients based on the patient's condition, any potential contraindications and the risks and benefits of various routes of administration
 - 2 hours about safe handling of marijuana products, including strategies to reduce access by minors
 - 2 hours about ethics and customer privacy and rights, and
 - 2 hours about the risks and warning signs of overuse, abuse and addiction



Certified Medical Marijuana Consultant

<u>Consultant Services</u>

The certified consultant is not a medical provider, and can only do the following:

- Enter the patient and designated providers information from the authorization form into the database
- Assist with product selection
- Describe risks and benefits of administration methods
- Advise on safe handling and storage of products
- Provide instruction on proper use
- <u>Services NOT Allowed</u>
 - Diagnose any conditions
 - Recommend modification or elimination of any treatment not involving medical use of marijuana
