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About the presenter



Mary Hatch-Maillette, PhD is Co-Director of the Pacific Northwest Node of the National Drug Abuse **Treatment Clinical Trials Network** (CTN), housed at the UW Alcohol & Drug Abuse Institute (ADAI). Having joined ADAI in 2003 to work on two CTN studies, Safer Sex for Men and Safer Sex for Women, she is now one of the longest-serving members of the PNW Node. She has since held a variety of local and national roles in eight additional clinical trials, most recently including the BEing Safe in Treatment (BEST) study and a newly funded project aimed at increasing pre-exposure prophylaxis treatment to people who use drugs and who are at high risk for HIV. Several of these studies have focused on counselors' skill and comfort in talking about sexual risk with patients in substance use treatment. Dr. Hatch-Maillette also maintains a private psychotherapy practice in Seattle. Her primary research interests are in substance use treatment, HIV risk behavior, and counselor workforce issues.
