



Syringe Service Programs

Syringe exchange, syringe sales, and syringe distribution in Washington State are legal. Syringe service programs can be authorized by a jurisdiction's health officer. For reference, see the <u>Washington State</u> Supreme Court ruling in Spokane County Health District v. Brockett 2.
