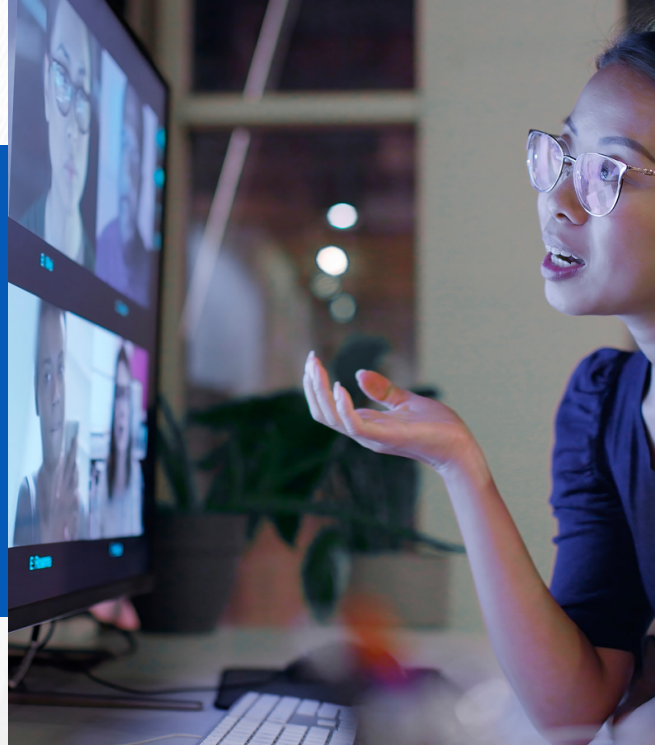




# SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER IN HOSPITAL SETTINGS
