

Syringe Service Program

- Safer injection equipment
 - Sharps disposal
- Safer sex kits
 - Pregnancy tests
- Wound care supplies
- Fentanyl test strips
- HIV and HCV testing
- Referral information for SUD tx
- Hygiene supplies
 - Pads and tampons



Overdose Prevention Program

- Narcan and/or Naloxone
 - CPR shields for rescue breathing
- Individual participants and organizations/agencies
 - Law enforcement
 - First responders
 - Shelters
 - SUD tx providers
 - Others



Harm Reduction Saves Lives


50% reduction in HIV and HCV incidence. 1

5 times more likely to enter Substance Use Disorder treatment. ²

46% reduction in Opioid overdose death rates. ³

Harm Reduction in Idaho

- Two legacy programs in 2019 to eight registered programs in 2022
- Mini-grant open to Idaho organizations
- Capacity-building and Technical Assistance
 - Peer-to-peer calls
 - Training: harm reduction 101, working with people who use drugs, overdose response and prevention, etc.
