# A Road to Recovery



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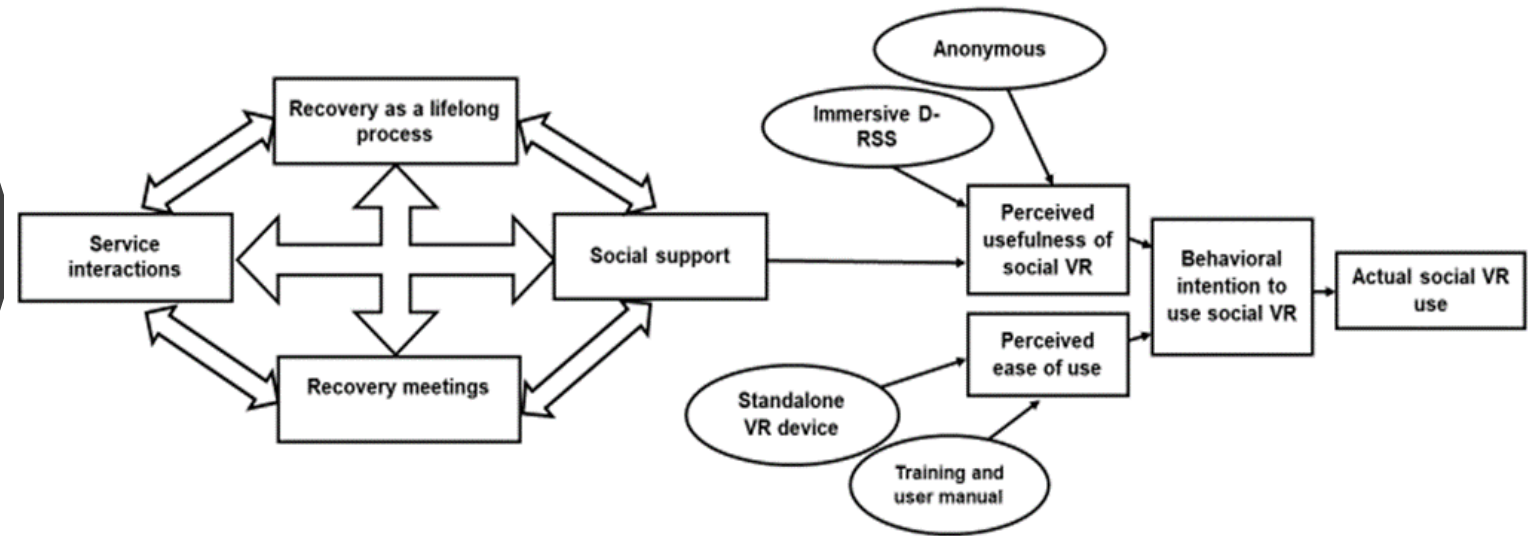
Social Virtual Reality Peer  
Recovery Support for Individuals  
Treated with Medications for  
Opioid Use Disorder

- **Aim 1:** Develop the materials, methods, and VR environment for a VR-based, MOUD-focused recovery support program for persons with OUD.
- **Aim 2:** Conduct a pilot trial to assess the usability, acceptability, and participant-level outcomes of the intervention.

# Pilot study

## Group

- VR manual
- Participants will be provided with an Oculus Quest 3.
- A total of 16 participants with OUD will be recruited (two groups)
  - 8 sessions once a week
  - Discussion topics each week (social support, mediation for OUD)

## Eligibility criteria

- 1) over the age of 18
- 2) is in recovery from OUD (self-identified as no illicit use of opioids and/or stable on MOUD for at least one month)
- 3) Willing to attend support groups for OUD
- 4) Has access to high-speed internet and basic technological knowledge (e.g., can operate a new technology that they are unfamiliar with if being trained).

## Exclusion criteria

- 1) Those who self-reported to have had extreme motion sickness and/or migraine headaches from previous VR-using experiences will be excluded.



## OUTCOMES

- Implementation Evaluation
  - Usability,
  - Acceptability of virtual support groups
- Recovery capital
- Social support
- Self-efficacy for avoiding drug use
- Substance use
- Attitudes towards MOUD
- Stigma

# The Potential of VR

- Virtual reality for the diagnosis and treatment of substance use disorders and problematic drug use
- Diagnostics with AI and human oversight (assessment)
- Treatment and content created from assessment
- Immersive interactive content designed with the user in mind
- Social spaces for recovery members to hangout
- Video-only content
- Module based with extra interactive content
