Guidelines for Digital Poster Submissions for the 2026 ADAI Symposium

Poster submissions should consist of ONE PowerPoint slide only (please use the **Widescreen/16x9** slide size). The posters will be projected onscreen during the lunch break and also made available (in PDF format) on the Symposium website.

1. Title Section (Top)

- Clear, concise title (~20 words)
- Your name(s) and affiliation
- Optional: logo(s)

2. Background / Objective

- 1-2 short sentences explaining:
 - Topic
 - Purpose or research question

3. Methods / Approach

- Use bullet points (3-5 max)
- Keep it simple and visual (icons or diagram if possible)

4. Key Results / Findings

- Highlight 2-3 main findings
- Use visuals:
 - Graphs, charts, or images
- Limit text — let visuals speak

5. Conclusion / Take-Home Message

- 1-2 strong statements
- Focus on impact or importance

6. Design Tips

- Use large fonts (minimum ~24-32 pt)
- Keep total words under ~200
- Use contrasting colors (a white background is preferred)
- Avoid clutter: use a lot of white space to make it easy to read quickly onscreen
- Consider clear, simple visuals over blocks of text

7. Optional Add-ons

- QR code to full paper or data
- Contact info (email)
- Acknowledgments (small text at bottom)

Goal: Viewer should understand your work in **1 to 2 minutes max.**

Please note that slides may be edited slightly after submission to ensure that they are optimized for a large screen and to enhance accessibility.
