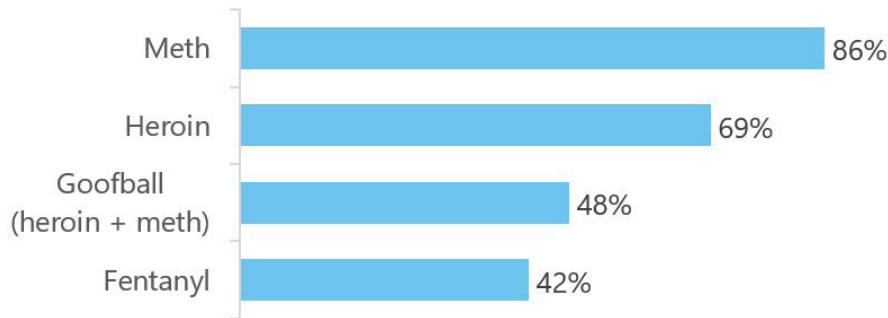


Thanks for taking our Syringe Services Program survey!

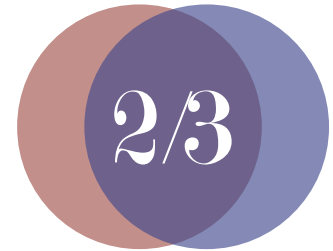
Here's what we learned from you.

Most people used opioids and stimulants.

What drugs have you used in the last three months?



2/3 used opioids **and** stimulants in the past week.



Most people don't share injection equipment.

Only 1 in 8 people shared a syringe in the past three months.

Only 3 in 8 people shared cottons or cookers.

Drug smoking

3 out of 4

people wanted **safer** drug smoking supplies.

Q **Would you inject less if you had safer smoking supplies?**
Most people, 64%, said YES.

Q **How many people do you know who smoke but don't inject?**
Average was 11.

What's going on with fentanyl?

3% said fentanyl was their "main drug," but
42% used it in the past three months.

64% of people who used fentanyl on purpose said it was a pill.

23% said it was a powder.



Overdose



1 in 4 people who used opioids **had an overdose** in the last year.
People who used fentanyl overdosed more often, 27% compared to 20%.

COVID-19

Over 1/3 of people were vaccinated for COVID-19.

One quarter of unvaccinated people were either interested in or neutral about getting the vaccine.
