Feasibility of Implementation Criteria

- Is there a cost? Is the cost prohibitive? (If yes, it could be a longer-term solution, which is important - track it but also find the lowhanging fruit and/or break down a longerterm solution into smaller steps!)
- Will the community want this idea? Will decision-makers support it?
 Is this a solution we can sustain?
- Are there "champions" that will make it happen? Do we have the right people to support it? Who else do we need on board and are we going to include them?
- Who might get in the way of getting this done? Can this be overcome?
- Is there a "home" for this project? Where will it live? We found solutions from last time were most successful if they had a home.
