PHASE 4: PROTOTYPING GENERATION + IMPLEMENTATION PLANNING - formulate recommendations, prototypes, and initiatives based on a greater understanding of the system. In this session, we will:

1. Continue building relationships across the co-design team.
2. Brainstorm potential prototypes and solutions to try.
3. Use a feasibility matrix to map prototype ideas to determine what to test.
4. Walk away with a solution(s) to test and implement and begin implementation.

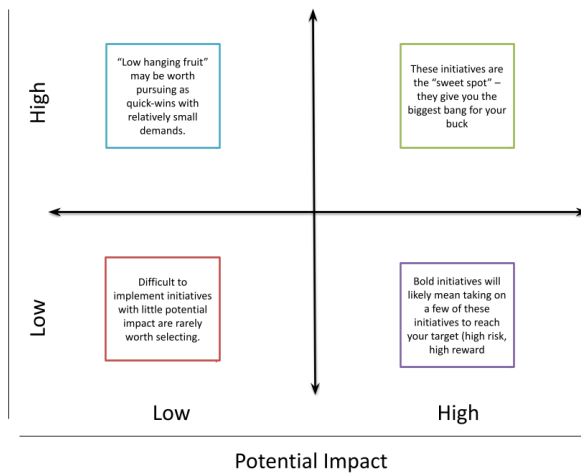
Once complete we will map these out on a feasibility matrix and vote on top ideas.

Feasibility of Implementation Criteria

- Is there a cost? Is the cost prohibitive? (If yes, it could be a longer-term solution, which is important - track it but also find the low-hanging fruit and/or break down a longer-term solution into smaller steps!)
- Will the community want this idea? Will decision-makers support it?
Is this a solution we can sustain?
- Are there “champions” that will make it happen? Do we have the right people to support it? Who else do we need on board and are we going to include them?
- Who might get in the way of getting this done? Can this be overcome?
- Is there a “home” for this project? Where will it live? We found solutions from last time were most successful if they had a home.

Potential Impact

- What can positively impact the most people in our community?

VOTE: Prioritize solutions through a voting process + generate a list of recommendations prioritized by the group. Come up with top 1-5 solutions. Next step will be to identify evidence to help narrow down to 1 or 2 solutions, such as feasibility/input from key agencies, input from people with living experience, and research.

Number solutions in high impact/feasibility
Vote on top 3-5 solutions by putting those numbers on a post-it note and put in a hat
Team members will then go through votes and mark them on the flipchart
